#### **Cotes du Rhone, Terres du Mistral 2010 (Languedoc)**

**£21.00**

*Fruit driven style enjoyed young. Benefiting from natural winemaking this is unfiltered, a modern wine with nothing taken out. Forest fruits with a hint of violet finishing on a note of peppery spice.*

#### **Premieres Cotes de Bordeaux, Chateau Deville 2005 (Bordeaux)**

*From the classic Bordeaux blend of Cabernet and Merlot this wine has good maturity, notes of cedar, cassis and a touch of savoury make it ideal to go with any well aged beef. A perfect partner to Sunday lunch.*
